#### MISSIONS UPDATE FROM THE MITCHELLS

Something that the Lord has taught us in the short time we've been here is the importance of knowing the language -- and knowing it well. There are so many beautiful truths and aspects of our faith that we can understand in our language that we want people from every nation, tribe, and language to understand!

Something that we have also been doing is casting vision for local churches to understand the fact that the Church that Jesus came to establish has a job to do. We are not just wandering about waiting for Jesus to come back. Our job as the church is to be faithful to the vision that Jesus gave John in Revelation 5:9, "And they sang a new song saying, "You are worthy to take the scroll and open its seals, because you were slain, and with your blood you purchased for God persons from every tribe and language and people and nation." This is a promise from the Lord that there WILL be people in heaven from every nation, tribe, language and people... including from the people groups that we don't like as much. In our context, Muslims are extremely looked down upon by the church and, well, the rest of society. Getting the Church (in our context, and around the world) to see this vision, this promise from the Lord is crucial for the Gospel to spread to every people group... even Muslims. It's important for the Church as a whole to understand this message because it's going to require the entire Kingdom of God to do the Kingdom work we were set apart for. Because, let's be honest, us white missionaries only have so much understanding of language, culture, and capacity to reach only a limited amount of people. But if the entire Kingdom of God partnered together to achieve His purpose, He will be most glorified.

Apart from language learning and vision casting for churches, our daily life consists of learning by doing and by living in such a way that actually shows that Jesus has changed our lives--and not being afraid to talk about it. Another thing we do is, after we do these vision castings, encourage members of the church to go out and share the Gospel, specifically with Muslims.

There was one day that I took a local brother out to teach him how we engage with Muslims. After every single time we shared the Gospel that day, he simply remarked, "Brother, I am just so happy to be out sharing the Good News of Jesus." I was so encouraged by this brother and still am. He is continually sharing his faith on a regular basis.

This is just one story of many of what God is doing in the local Church here, and in the Gospel sharing initiatives beginning in many of the churches here.

Praise God for what He's doing!

### PASTORS PERSPECTIVE




